As always with CMMA, we've had well attended meetings that have delivered valuable knowledge and insight. We've graciously toured world class manufacturing firms that are proud of their work and eager to share their success. We've celebrated organizational longevity and continuity with many 5 year membership awards. Did you know that today there are more high school robotics teams than boys' hockey squads in Minnesota? Robotics, the high school "varsity sport of the mind", is surging nation-wide and Minnesota has the third highest number of teams in the country. Congratulations to the Becker High School Robotics Team, 2013 FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) Robotics State Champions! CMMA also says "great job" to the St. Cloud Technical High School SkillsUSA team. This team of "Project Lead the Way" students was named 2013 National Engineering Champions in the Engineering Technology/Design competition in Kansas City this past June with their "Drill and Pop" invention. For Technical High School it's "twice as nice" as last year's team also took home the national title in the same competition. CMMA also says "well done' to the Cold Spring Boy Scouts "Boss Botz" VEX robotics team for their award winning success at both state and national competition.

We also recognize program mentors, teachers and supporters including CMMA members Xcel Energy and Darter Plastics. CMMA understands that these programs

Featured Member: Darter Plastics



Darter Plastics is a custom injection molding company located in Becker MN. Founded in 1986, Darter now has 23 employees working three shifts, five days a week.

Our primary service is injection molded parts. We have 15 presses ranging from 60 ton up to 310 ton. We mold all thermoplastic materials in almost any color, and are able to grind everything we do not use to run back through the machines, leaving virtually no scrap. We work with many local companies, but also ship product to China, Singapore and Mexico.

One example of a long term local partnership is with X-cel Optical out of Sauk Rapids. We deliver the finished product for no charge because of their location (only 20 miles). More importantly, we can re-mold the product after they are done using it in their lens making process. We re-grind the product and mold it again and again. We run most of their products out of 75 percent regrind, providing a substantial cost savings to them as well as keeping the parts out of the landfill. It is a "win win" partnership for both companies.

Some other companies we work with include Arctic Cat, Cummins, Manitowoc Ice, Tyco, and Frabill.

In addition to injection molding, Darter Plastics also offers pad printing, hot stamping and assembly services. Pad Printing uses a silicone pad to transfer ink onto any surface. It is unique because you can print on curved and dimpled surfaces like a golf ball. The finished print is very clear and durable. Hot Stamping uses a foil tape along with heat and pressure to transfer an image onto a flat surface.

Our Assembly area utilizes many different processes to put together various parts for a number of companies. These parts include drive assemblies for a packaging company as well as water probes for use in commercial ice machines. Some examples of assembly operations include spot welding, soldering, ultrasonic welding, gluing, drilling, taping, and packaging. Some products are ready to go directly from our shop floor to the shelves of the big retailers.

Darter also offers engineering and design services. We will take an idea from concept to completion. We also have inhouse mold making capabilities.

CMMA Golf Social Supports Manufacturing Scholarships and Robotics Teams

High school robotics teams, such as VEX and FIRST, and post-secondary students focused on manufacturing careers will benefit from a successful event staged by CMMA on June 24, 2013. Over seventy people ventured out on a gorgeous summer day to attend the first-annual CMMA Golf Social, held at Territory Golf Club in St. Cloud. The 18-hole Texas Scramble raised some \$2,500.

The tournament featured sponsored events, such as a "fishing contest" and a "marshmallow chip," along with the CM-MA-sponsored longest drive, longest putt, and closest to the pin contests. A cash prize was awarded to the first place team from Schlenner Wenner: Brian Mackinac, Aaron Smith, Ryan Finberg, and Brian Schellinger. Team scores ranged from a low of 58 to a high of 75 on a 72-Par course.

CMMA sold 50/50 raffle tickets tickets throughout the day, with the winning ticket claimed by Dan Meyer, International Precision Machine. Dan graciously donated the \$200 cash prize back to the association in support of scholarships and robotics teams.

Since its inception in 2008, CMMA has provided financial support for high school robotics teams and other endeavors that are believed to change perceptions about careers in manufacturing. Many young people are excited to learn about the high wage, high tech job opportunities to be found at manufacturing facilities in small town USA, in large metropolitan areas, and everywhere in between. Proceeds from the Golf Social will allow CMMA to become even more active in providing financial support.
